In the Name of God Amen I James Daniels of Macclesfield in the County of Chester Innholder being indisposed but of sound mind memory and understanding and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs do make publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say
- 2. First I direct all my just debts funeral expences and the charges of proving this my Will by my Executrix hereinafter named to be paid immediately after my decease
- 3. I Give Devise and bequeath unto my Niece Dinah Staytham who now lives with me the sum of Twenty Pounds
- And all my household goods and furniture, ready money, monies out at Interest, Book and other debts and all other my Personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever I give and bequeath the same unto my beloved Wife Martha Daniels her Executors Administrators and Assigns for her and their own sole and absolute use and disposal paying thereout the said Legacy of Twenty Pounds
- And I hereby nominate my said Wife sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament and hereby revoking all former Wills by me made I do hereby declare this to be my last Will and Testament
- In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the fourth day of November One thousand eight hundred and eleven James Daniel
