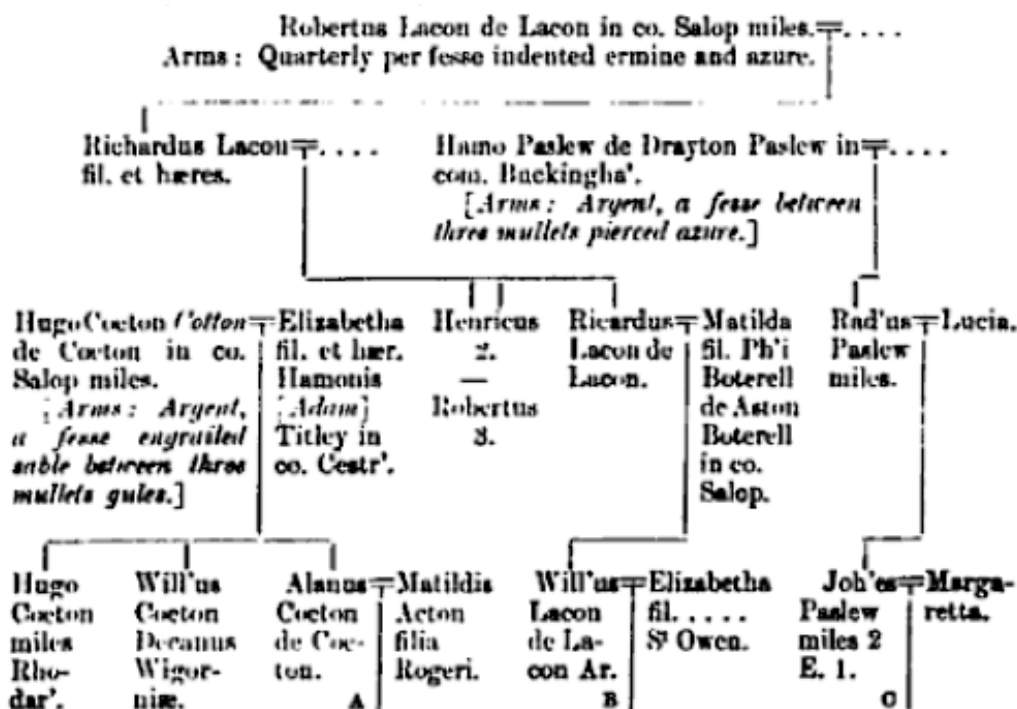

ARMS: Harl. 1396.—Quarterly of twenty-three: 1, Quarterly per fesse indented ermine and azure, LACON; 2, Argent, a lion rampant quervée fourchée sable, STANLOWE, SANTILOW [STANLAWET]; 3, Argent, a fesse engrailed sable between three mullets gules, COTTON, COETON; 4, Argent, on a fesse gules three plates, TITLEY; 5, Argent, three crescents sable, a canton gules, HEYTON; 6, Argent, a fesse between three mullets pierced azure, PASLOWE; 7, Argent, a cross fleury sable [on a canton gules a wolf's head erased argent], PESHALL; 8, Or, a bend collized sable, HARLEY; 9, Or, on a chief sable three taws of the first, PRESTOPE; 10, Sable, three mullets of six points pierced argent, PYULDEN, PULISDON [PULESTON]; 11, Or, fretty azure, a canton gules, WILLEY; 12, Argent, on a bend sable three escallops of the field, REMLEIGH, KENLEY [sic]; 13, Or, two lions passant gules, BRAMPTON; 14, Or, two lions passant-guardant gules, ST. VALOREY; 15, Barry of six vairés ermine and azure, and gules, BRUSE; 16, Gules, two bends, the upper one or, the other argent, MYLO; 17, Gules, five fusils in fesse or, NEWMARCH; 18, Gules, a bend fusilly or, MARSHALL; 19, Or, six lions rampant sable [two, two, and two], STRONGBOW; 20, Sable, three garbs argent—banded gules in Shrewsbury MS.—MACMOROUGH; 21, Azure, three round buckles or, REMEVILL; 22, Or, two ravens sable, CORBETT OF CAUS; 23, Or, on a chief indented azure three annulets of the first [argent?], HEREFORD.

CREST.—A hawk close proper, beaked and belled or.

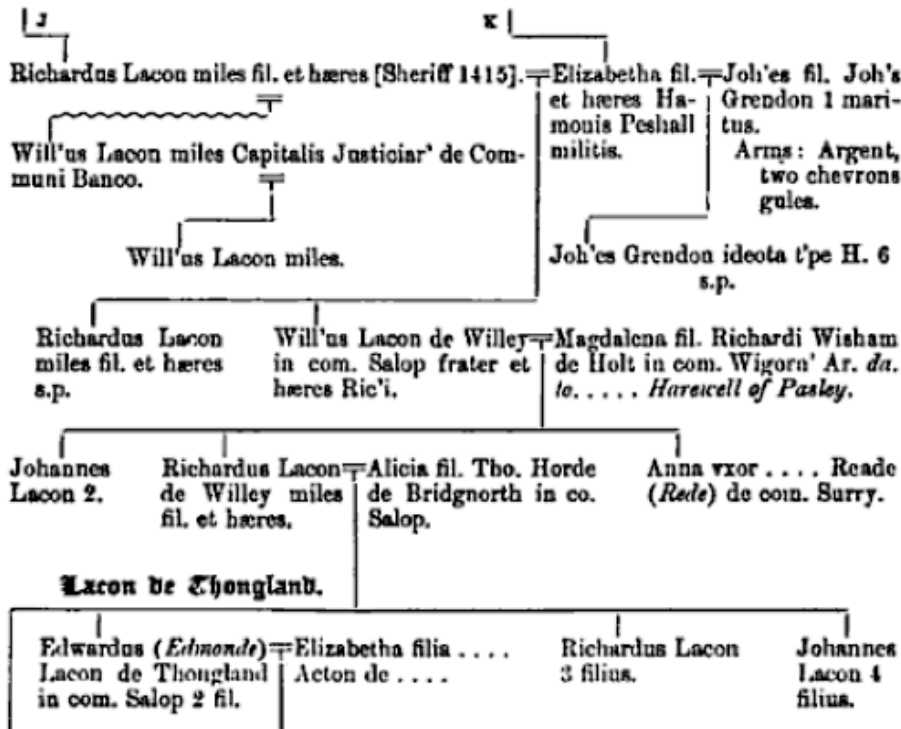
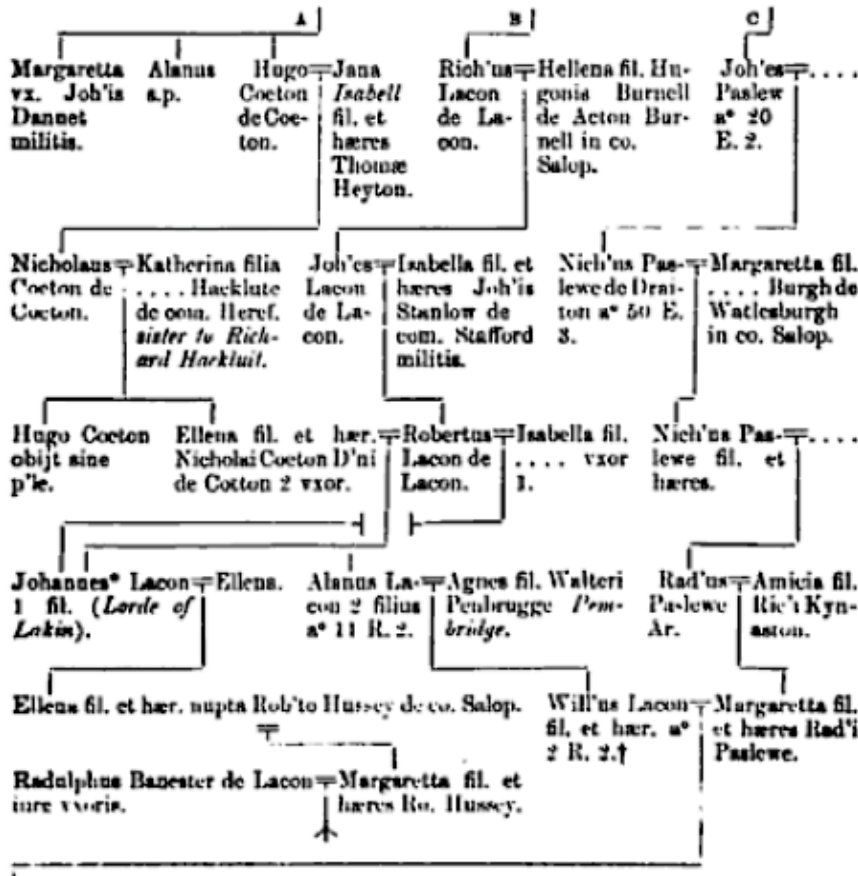
MOTTO.—CONOY VOUS MESME.

ARMS: Harl. 615.—Quarterly of six: 1 and 6, Quarterly per fesse indented ermine and azure; 2, Argent, a cross engrailed humettée sable; 3, Argent, a bend collized sable [HARLEY?]; 4, Azure, three oval buckles or [REMEVILL]; 5, Argent, three chevrons gules, within a bordure engrailed sable.

† Sir Rafo de Stanlaw bore these arms. (Staff. Knights, temp. E. 1.)



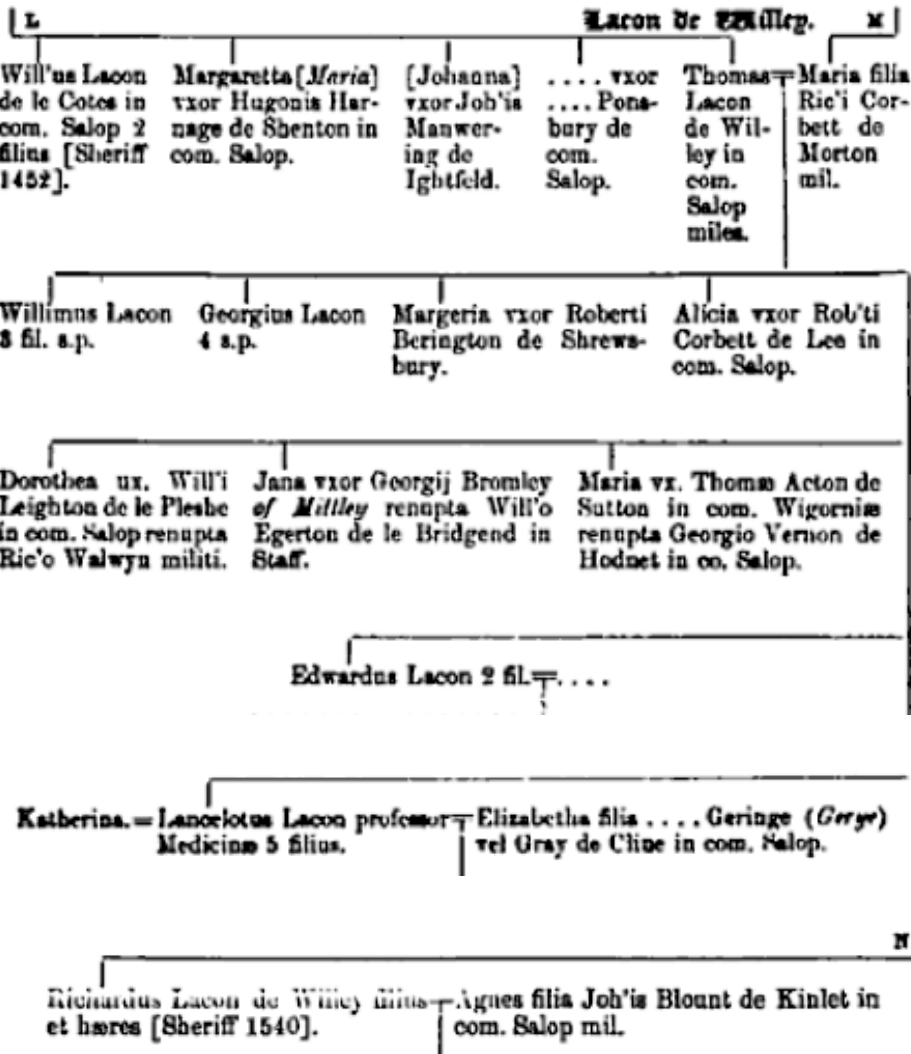
