In the name of God amen

- 1. The six and twentieth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred twenty seven I <u>Cordell Meye of South Lynn in the County of Norfolk Widow</u> sick in body but of sound and perfect memory (thanks be given to almighty God) revoking all former wills and testaments by me made do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
- 2. Imprimus I commend my soul into the hands of my almighty Creator being fully assured through the righteousness of my blessed Redeemer Jesus Christ that all my sins are forgiven me and that when he shall come in his glory to judge the quick and the dead I shall rise with him in glory unto everlasting life
- 3. And for my body if I die in Lynn my desire is to be buried in the parish church of South Lynn by my husband
- 4. Item I give towards the repairs of the said church of South Lynn forty shillings
- 5. Item I give to the poor of the same parish forty shillings
- 6. Item I give to him that shall preach at my burial twenty shillings
- 7. Item I give to my son Henry Meye a bible of 20 pence
- 8. Item I give to my <u>son John Meye one hundred pound</u> bond I have of his provided he discharge his brother Stephen Mey of the bond of one hundred and fifty pounds they stand jointly bound unto me and twenty shillings beside to make him a seal ring

- 9. Item I give to my daughter Margarett Fawcett forty shillings to make her a ring
- 10. Item I give to my <u>daughter Margery Browne five pounds</u> of that forty pounds her husband owes me And my will is that he or she shall ? to my executors all such implements of household stuff and other goods as I bought of George Stedman and likewise such goods of my own as I lent them according to an Inventory thereof made or else they shall take no benefit of this my legacy but be ? to my executors their ?
- 11. Item I give unto <u>Cordell Meye my daughter ten pounds</u> to be paid her within twelve months after my decease and also ten pounds more to be set out presently after my decease of all my moveable goods
- 12. Item I give to <u>Mary Meye my daughter ten pounds</u> to be paid her within twelve months after my decease
- 13. Item I give to my <u>daughter Sturgis</u> my best Tuff taffety gown kirtle and bodice belonging thereunto and also <u>ten pounds</u> to be likewise paid her within twelve months after my decease
- 14. Item I give to my <u>daughter Deborah Horne ten pounds</u> to be likewise paid her within twelve months after my decease
- 15. Item I give to my <u>daughter Grace Meye one hundred pounds</u> her father gave her in his will and <u>twenty pounds her grandmother gave her</u> and <u>four score more</u> to make up her portion <u>two hundred pounds</u> Provided that she discharge her brother Stephen Meye of the forty pounds due to her within six months after my decease by the last will and testament of her father nor shall make claim to any bonds or securities taken in her name And my will is that she shall receive the interest of the said portion as it shall grow due for and towards her maintenance And her said portion to be paid her within one whole year next after my decease
- 16. Item I give to my <u>daughter Sarah Meye the hundred pounds</u> her father gave her which is in her brother Henry his hands and I give her more <u>one hundred pounds as a gift</u> from myself And also it is my will that she shall be paid the forty pounds which her father gave her by his will to be paid unto her by her brother Stephen Meye within six months next after my decease and that the use of the said moneys shall be hereby paid unto her towards her maintenance until she shall attain unto the age of 22 years or she be married
- 17. And my earnest desire is that my worthy good friend Sr Thomas Hoogan to be pleased to take into his tuition and government and to have the disposing of her said portion giving unto her fit education and maintenance according to her quality and portion
- 18. Item I give to my <u>daughter Theodora Meye one hundred pounds</u> her father gave her in his will and <u>one other hundred pounds more</u> to augment her portion provided always that upon the payment of the said two hundred pounds to her or ? for her use she shall fully discharge my son Stephen Meye of the forty pounds given her by her father his will to be paid by the said Stephen within six months after my decease
- 19. And I do heartily desire my loving <u>cousin Mrs Thiphosa Clarke widow</u> to take her into her tuition and the bringing of her up until she attain to her age of 22 years or be married my executors allowing her the use of the said two hundred pounds for her maintenance provided always that is any of my three daughters Grace Sara & Theodora Meye last mentioned shall

depart this life before they shall come to full age or be married that then the portion of them or her that shall survive shall be equally divided between them

- 20. Item my will and mind is that my <u>son Stephen Meye</u> shall have my best bedstead with the bed one pair of blankets my best coverlet and two pillows belonging thereunto four pair of sheets two fine two coarse and also all the implements of household stuff and other things of my own which are now in the possession of my son Browne
- 21. Item which was before omitted I give to <u>Elizabeth Sedgwick my daughter ten pounds</u> of the twenty pounds her husband owe me
- 22. All the residue of my goods and chattels household stuff plate jewels and apparel unbequeathed my debts and legacies paid and funeral charges deducted shall be equally divided between my said three daughters Grace Sara and Theodora
- 23. Item my will is that if it shall happen that any of the debts owing me which I now account good shall prove otherwise Then my will and meaning is that my three daughters abovenamed shall equally bear the loss (if any there happen to be) amongst them and shall answer my executors all such necessary costs and charges as shall be expended about the execution of this my will
- 24. And for the true performance of this my last will and testament I do constitute and ordain my loving son Stephen Meye together with Grace Meye and Theodora Mey two of my daughters executors of this my last will and testament
- 25. In witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal the day and year first above written by me <u>Cordell Meye</u> sealed and delivered in the presence of us Ja. Sedgwick Henry Horne Christopher Browne
