- 1. In the Name of God Amen the six and twentieth day of October one thousand six hundred fiftie three I William Steyt of Idbury in the County of Oxford yeoman beinge weake in bodie but perfect memory (I praise god for it) considering the frayletie of mans life to be but as a shadow, doe ordaine and make this my last will and Testament in manner and forme followinge
- 2. First I commend my Soule into the handes of Allmightie God beleiveing to have forgivenes of my sinnes by the death & passion of Jesus Christ my Saviour and Redeemer
- 3. and my body I bequeath to the Earth to be buryed in Christian buryall
- 4. And as for my worldly Goods which the Lord of his gracious goodnes hath lente mee I dispose of them as followeth
- 5. First I give to the poore of Idbury tenne shillings to be devided at the discretion of my Executor and overseers of the poore at the time beinge

- 6. Also I give & bequeath to the Fower sonnes of my brother Edward Twentie Pounds (that is to say) to his sonne William Eight pounds And to the other Three fower pounds a peece
- 7. Also I give & bequeath to the children of my Sister Mary Twentie poundes (that is to say) to her daughter Anne five poundes and to the other five Three poundes a peece
- 8. Alsoe I give to my Brother John Five poundes
- 9. Also I give unto the two daughters of my brother John Fortie shillings a peece and to his Two sonnes James and Richard Twentie shillinges a peece
- 10. Also I give & bequeath to the two daughters of my Brother Alexander three poundes a peece
- 11. And to his sonne William Fortie shillinges
- 12. Alsoe I give to Anne the daughter of my brother Thomas Fortie shillinges
- 13. Alsoe I give to the Two children of James Cooke tenne shillinges a peece
- 14. Also I give and bequeath to Thomas Steyt the sonne of my brother Alexander six poundes thirteene shillinges Fower pence to bind him Apprentice and tenne poundes more after his Apprenticeship is out
- 15. Alsoe I give to John Powis the sonne of John Powis and of my Sister Elinor Twentie shillinges
- 16. Alsoe I give to Joane Andrewes the daughter of Thomas Andrewes Five poundes
- 17. Alsoe I give to his daughter Alice twentie shillinges
- 18. Alsoe I give to Simeon Baylies Servant tenne shillinges and to the other two Servants fyve shillinges a peece
- 19. Alsoe I give to Anne my loveing wife All her Apparrell that now she hath and all her househould stuffe she brought with her to mee (that is to say) All her linnen soollen beddinge brasse and pewter and all thinges else which she hath in an Inventory (except the Table board and frame form in the Hall) Alsoe I give unto her one Cowe and two sheepe and the Bees in the Garden
- 20. Also I give to my brother Edward my best suite of Apparrell as Hatt Coate Doublet hose a paire of stockings and a paire of shoes
- 21. Alsoe I give to my brother John my second suite of Apparrell as Coate Doublet hose a paire of stockings and a Shirte
- 22. Alsoe I give unto ould John Howford my Third suite of Apparrell
- 23. Alsoe I give to my brother Thomas one of my Greate Coates
- 24. Alsoe I give to Jonathan Pound the sonne of Robert Pound two shillinges six pence
- 25. Also I give to Thomas Phillipps twelve pence

- 26. and to Richard Hathaway the sone of Richard Hathaway twelve pence
- 27. and to Joane Gardner the daughter of John Gardner twelve pence
- 28. and to William Fox the sonne of John Fox twelve pence
- 29. Also emy will is that those Legacies which I have given and bequeathed to my kindred which are under age to give a discharge to my Executor at the time of my death My will is that the sonnes shall have their Legacies at the age of one and twentie yeares and the daughters at the age of Eighteen yeares
- 30. And my will is that the rest of the Legacies which I have given the tyme not named shall be payed within one yeare next after my decease
- 31. Alsoe I do ordaine and make William Steite my kinsman the sonne of my brother Thomas my full and whole Executor of all the rest of my goodes unbequeathed my debts payed my Legacies performed and my funerall expences discharged
- 32. Also I doe give to Joane Steyte the wife of my brother Alexander Fower bushells of Millcorne
- 33. Alsoe I doe request my Neighbours Thomas Coirne? and John Simes to be my Overseers of this my last will & Testament
- 34. And I doe give them for their paines takinge herein twelve pence apeece
